



Should I submit a Compassionate Appeal?



If you have been prevented from demonstrating your ability during an examination or assessment because of a serious health circumstance or unanticipated extenuating circumstance beyond your control, you may submit a request for a Compassionate Appeal.

What is a Compassionate Appeal?

A Compassionate Appeal is a request for the Executive Committee to make a special consideration to void the results of your examination or assessment due to circumstances outside of your control.

How do I submit a request for a Compassionate Appeal?

A Compassionate Appeal Request Form must be completed and emailed to appeals@ndeb-bned.ca.

When should I submit my request for a Compassionate Appeal?

Requests must be submitted within 7 days of the examination or assessment date.

What documentation do I need to submit?

Requests should include details regarding the circumstances underlying the request, supporting documentation, and the desired outcome.

What happens with my submission?

Requests are kept confidential. Your name and any identifying information, except for your NDEB identification number, are removed from the documentation submitted. This documentation is provided to the NDEB Executive Committee for review.

When will my request be reviewed by the Executive Committee?

Your request will be considered at the next scheduled Executive Committee meeting. If additional documentation is needed, you will be notified by email.

When will I know the decision of the Executive Committee?

A report outlining the Executive Committee's decision will be sent to you by email about 4 weeks after the meeting. This decision is final.
